MICHAEL'S MASONIC ESOTERICA

I recently reviewed my Masonic library with an eye towards the oldest books. It is likely I have modern reprints of even older books, but my attention fell on three old original hard bound volumes. "Ancient Mysteries and Modern Masonry" by Rev. C. H. Vail, 1909, "The Men's House" by Joseph Port Newton, 1923, and "The Lodge and the Craft" by Rollin C. Blackmer, 1923.

I like looking at the oldest Masonic texts I can find because we learn from our forbears. Coming into Masonry we know little about our culture, our ethics, or how we are expected to conduct ourselves. We can only learn this from our brothers who have been in Masonry for a while. I feel like the further back in time I go in regards to this education of our core values, the closer I get to what might have been the original intent of the Great Institution of our Gentle Craft. I do not doubt at all that the lapse of time and the ruthless hand of ignorance has hidden the real secrets even deeper by being forgotten and overlooked by an uneducated Masonry. The word "ignorance" in the above well recognized quote, is a technical spiritual term to refer to one who has not realized who they really are yet; i.e., one who is not yet Self realized, or to use an overused term, enlightened. But then that is why Masonry is all about the perenial, eternal, creative Light that pervades all nature. Ignorance is the ruthless destroyer. The pure light of our original source is the harmony that will one day exist in our world when all humans are awakened. But I digress.

The oldest of these three books, the 1909 book "Ancient Mysteries and Modern Masonry" by Rev. C. H. Vail leads one down an interesting path. The author actually has an entry in Wikipedia, and there are three of his books listed on Amazon. The one mentioned here is available as an eBook for a dollar. Mine is an original 1909 hard copy and is very delicate. While the National Organizer of the Social Democratic Party of America, forerunner of the Socialist Party of America, Vail toured the United States speaking on various socialist topics for seven of the first nine months of 1901, traveling over 14,000 miles and visiting 19 states.

On January 1, 1901, Vail was nominated by the Social Democratic Party of New Jersey as its candidate for Governor of New Jersey. After resting for the month of September, Vail hit the campaign trail. In the immediate aftermath of the August assassination of President William McKinley by Leon Czolgosz, an anarchist, Vail faced hostile crowds and suffered cancelled meetings by those who confused the doctrines of socialism and anarchism. Vail refused to bow to intimidation and delivered 29 addresses during the course of the 1901 campaign. By the end of the year, Vail had toured 25 states and delivered 241 public lectures.

He had considerable experience and skill as a public speaker (he spent the rest of his working life as a pastor), so it makes sense when we learn that "Ancient Mysteries and Modern Masonry" is a collection of a series of lectures, first given in Pullman Memorial Church, Albion, New York. The purpose of these lectures is to consider the origin and nature of the Ancient Mysteries and Modern Masonry and to show the relation which they bear one to the other. Chapters include The Egyptian, Hindu and Persian Mysteries, The Christian Mysteries, The Meaning Of True Initiation, Masonic History, and The Origin and History of the Knights Templars.

The inside front cover of my original 1909 copy has an image of a globe with latitude and longitude lines, but no continents drawn, and instead has images of the G with rays coming out of it at the top, the Royal Arch keystone in the middle, the double headed eagle of the Scottish Rite (which could be a Pheonix or a Gandaberunda, but that's another fascinating subject) on the right, Knights Templar on the left, and a square, a compass (not together in the normal fashion),

a plumb, a level, and a holy bible below. In the 10:00 position there is an inverted triangle with rays coming out of it, and the triangle is centered in three concentric circles of short rays. I do not know what that symbol is. Above this world image is a Swastika. This was 11 years before the earliest recorded use of the ancient symbol by Germany, so I'm sure the author meant to use it for it's ancient esoteric aspect, and not as a political statement.

In the very first pages of the book he speaks about our mysteries having "...their origin from the first great Teachers and Guides of humanity". These are called "Sons of Venus", they formed the "Nursery of Adepts"-the nucleus of the first Great White Lodge. Surrounding the Chief there was a small band of Beings who came to earth to labor for the evolution of young humanity. Another class of Beings who aided in this work was called Agnishvattas...". He goes on: "There were many already in possession of occult knowledge who were so engrossed in selfishness that they could not be brought into the divine path; and their abuse of this power over the forces of nature made them giants of evil."

He continues a page on: "Antiquity had held that there was a science of the soul, a knowledge of things unseen, a Gnosis..."

And finally I want to share a section from the most interesting chapter: "The Meaning of True Initiation": "The six qualifications (a) Control of Thoughts-purity and calmness which result from control of the mind. (b) Control of Actions-mastery of one's actions and words. (c) Tolerance-freedom from bigotry, from an exaggerated attachment to any doctrinal belief, leading to a wide impartiality. (d) Forbearance-freedom from resentment in respect to real or fancied wrongs. 9e) Steadfastness-incapability of being turned aside from one's purpose. (f) Faith-confidence in the power of the Master to reach the truth, and of one's self to grasp and wield it."
