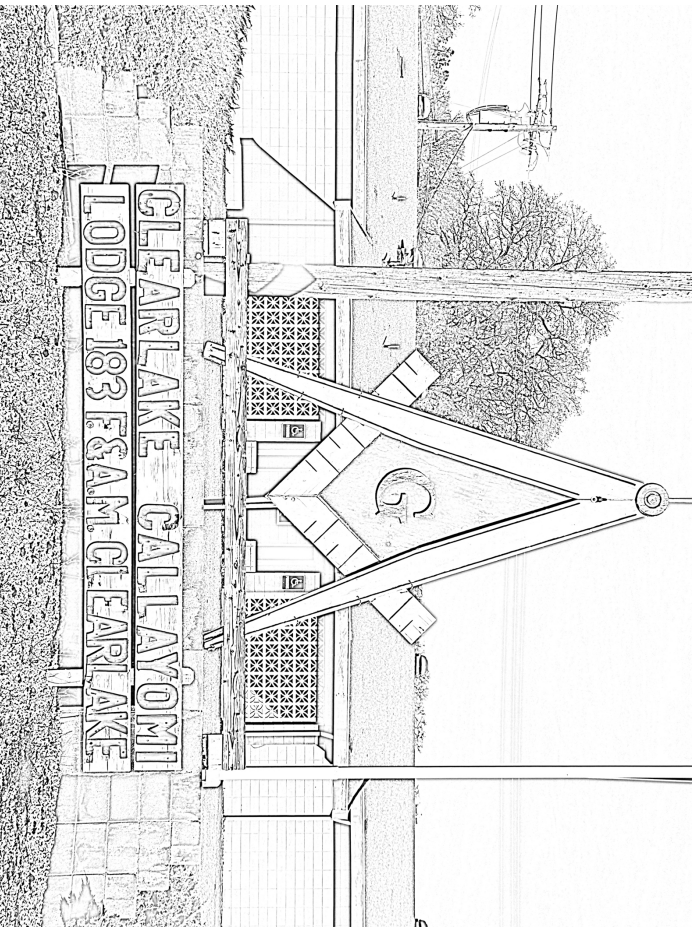

Freemasonry's history is complex, and its secrets are myriad and span from ancient mystery school traditions, alchemy, Hermeticism, and of course the obvious work of a modern Mason of living a life of integrity and spreading the concept of civility and peace around the world.

This month I will expose you to a fascinating idea about ancient old world architecture. Modern historical researchers have been compiling evidence for over a decade suggesting a regularly repeating cataclysmic event has caused human population resets and the re-writing of world history in our recent past. The suggestion from this research is that the thousands of Romanesque stone and marble buildings in the United States that today are state capital buildings, libraries, post offices and schools were built by an advanced previous civilization that was largely wiped out by these cataclysmic events. The suggestion from this research is that as these buildings were found partially buried and over grown they were dug out, cleaned up and re-purposed and were given found dates, called 'founded'. We have assumed the term 'founded' was just a fancy old world term for 'built', but maybe it does literally mean when they were found.

These impressive stone buildings often involve hundreds of thousands of tons of beautiful perfectly carved and shaped marble and other stone, often with, for example, hundreds of perfectly and exactly carved balustrades and interior and exterior columns, supposedly built at a time when there were no power tools and horse and buggy was the primary form of transportation. Early photos of these buildings show no improved roads that would have been necessary to move the massive stones and other building materials.

Supposedly there were so many talented architects at the time that could design and build these buildings that they held design competitions, the architects winning often being very young and supposedly, according to newspaper records, building many similar

buildings across the country at the same time.

Curiously, the historical record of very many of these buildings state that they are the second or third iteration of the building, as these stone buildings are said to be lost to fire and re-built on the same site with remarkable speed, many of these massive, impressive stone buildings being recorded as taking only a year to build from the ground up. Today no one believes the fire narrative (these are solid stone buildings after all), and views this history of supposed rebuilds as an attempt to obfuscate that these buildings were preexisting and built by a previous civilization.

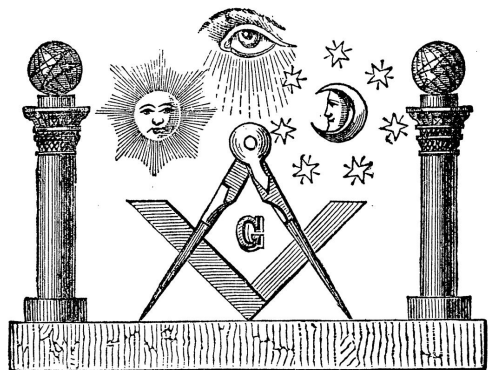
I have compiled a list of over 100 of these ancient looking stone edifice buildings that history records as being 'founded' by Freemasons. I suspect the actual number may be far more than that.

None of the modern historical researchers studying this early architecture believe the narratives we are given about the history of these buildings. There is the suggestion that the term "Freemason" referred to a group of people that were in the business of finding and cleaning up what were essentially free for the taking megalithic masonry buildings.

I have long speculated (we are speculative Masons after all) that Freemasonry might exist as a message in a bottle, hiding secrets about our past from a time when our past was being taken from us and being re-written.

But it is also possible that Masonry started, not by men that wanted to preserve information about our past, but by the men that were trying to hide our past.
